


NEW AT THE BRANCH!

We need: fiction (hardcover and paperback books, including graphic novels); non-fiction books (all topics); children's books (fiction and non-fiction); young adult/teen fiction; audio-books; music CDs; DVDs; and video games.

To donate your items, simply drop them off at the account services desk at the Dundee Library. You will receive a form for tax deductions if you wish. Please do not use the book return slots for your donations.




