



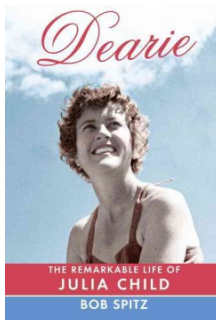

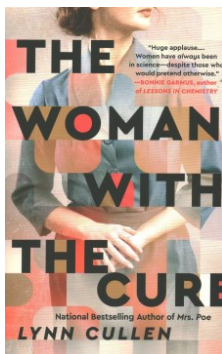

by Bob Spitz

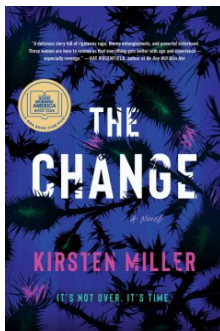

by Kirsten Miller

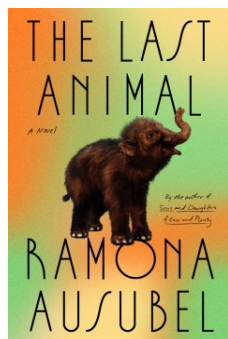

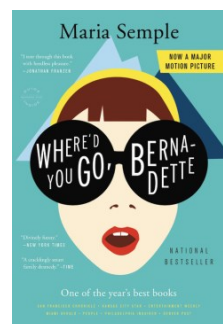


The last animal

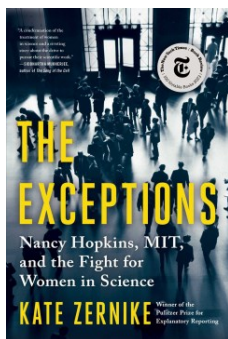

by Maria Semple

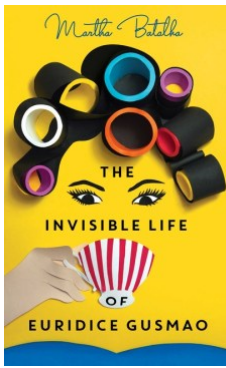
