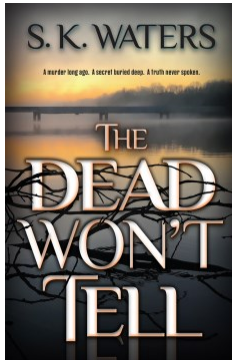


Miss Morton and the English house party murder
