



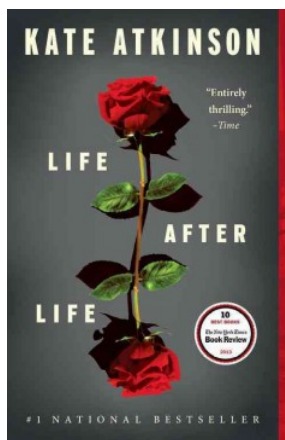

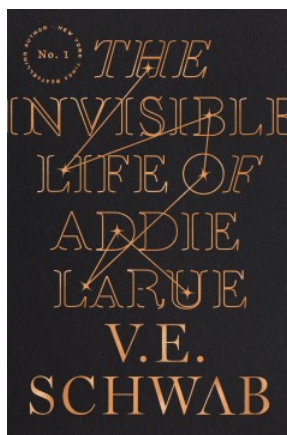

by Kate Atkinson

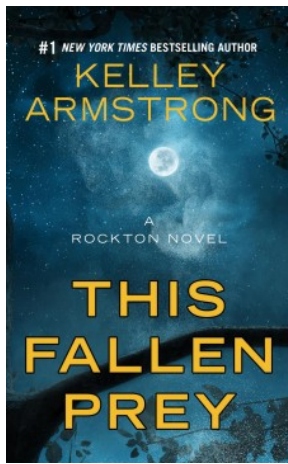
Follows the experiences of a woman who, after being born on a snowy night in 1910, repeatedly dies and reincarnates into the same life to correct missteps and ultimately save the world

by V. E. Schwab

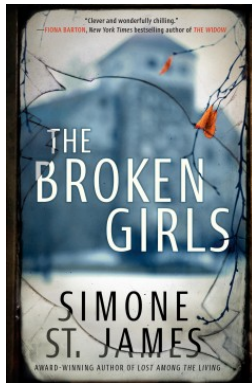

by Kelley Armstrong

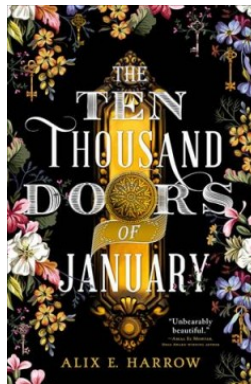

by Simone St. James

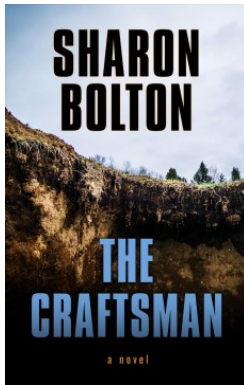

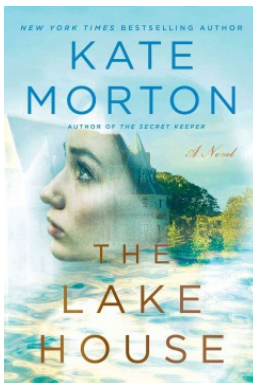

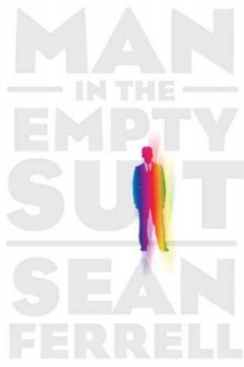


The Lake House

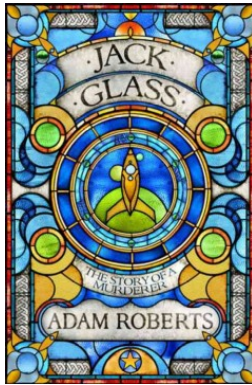

by Sean Ferrell

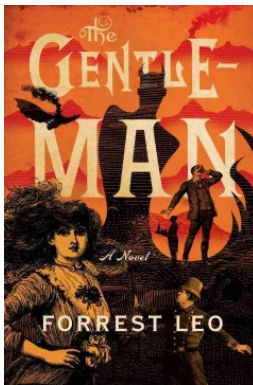

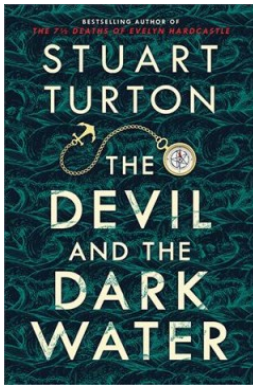


The Gentleman
