



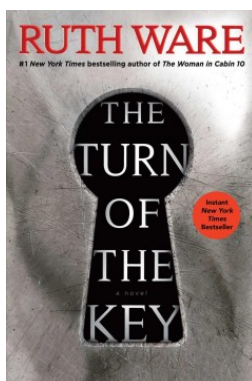

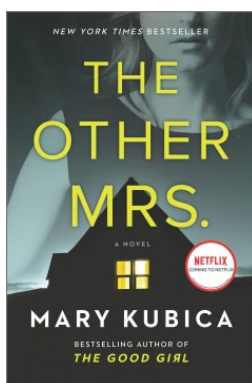

by Ruth Ware

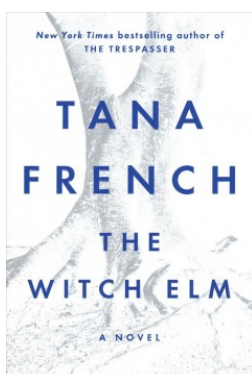
When a high-paying nanny job at a luxurious Scottish Highlands home culminates in her imprisonment for a child's murder, a young woman struggles to untangle what really happened.

by Mary Kubica

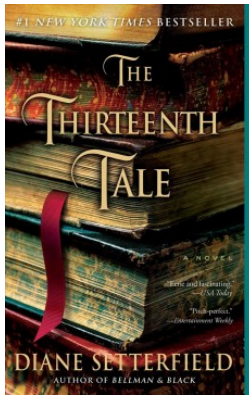

by Tana French

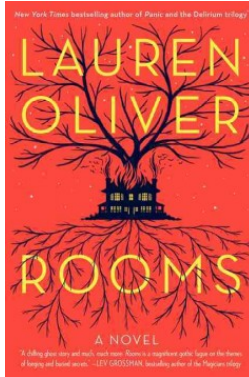

by Diane Setterfield

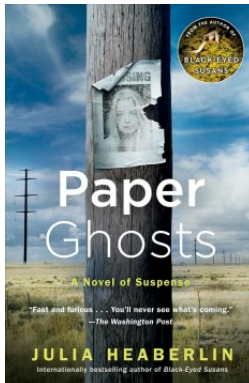

by Lauren Oliver

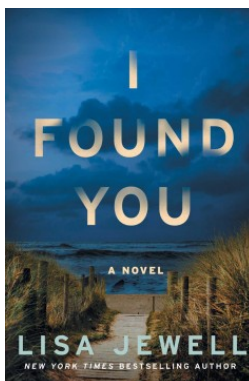

by Julia Heaberlin

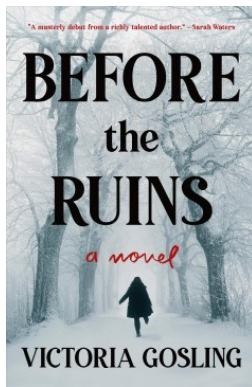

by Lisa Jewell

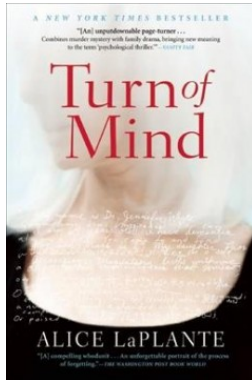

by Victoria Gosling

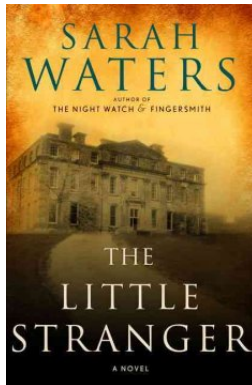

by Alice LaPlante

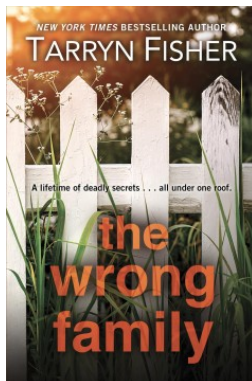

by Sarah Waters

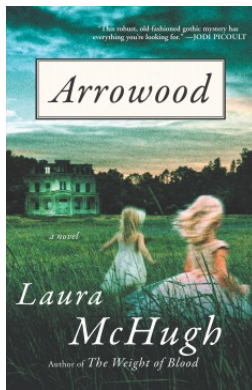

An off-kilter narrator witnesses the slow unraveling of a couple's strained marriage that erupts in unexpected ways, in a chilling tale of domestic suspense.

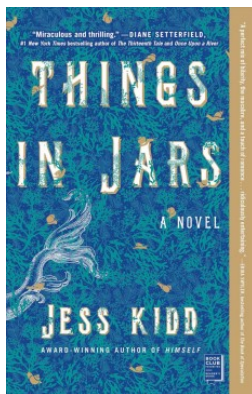


## Arrowwood

Inheriting the grand historical home of her childhood twenty years after her twin sisters were abducted, Arden endeavors to find out what really happened and confronts devastating family secrets.

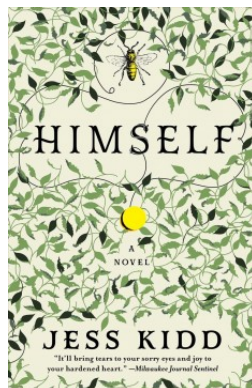
