CHALKTOWN by Melinda Haynes. A mysterious southern town where residents communicate by using chalkboards in their front yards provides the setting for this story.

SAILING TO BYZANTIUM by Robert Silverberg. A collection of five novellas by the Nebula and Hugo Award winning Sci-fi novelist.

SISTERS by Tim Stafford. 30 years of the American suffrage movement are interwoven with the story of Californian Susan Nichols and the personal everyday struggles of her life.

◆ 1876 LIBRARY READING ROOM ON DISPLAY

The Dundee Township Historical Society has assembled a handsome display in honor of our Library's 125th Anniversary. Here is an opportunity to view a 19th Century Library Reading Room, complete with books, furniture, light fixtures and statuary. The wooden table and bookcase, for instance, are antiques from the Carpentersville Library and Literary Society, once located on Carpentersville's Washington St.



This unique reconstruction also affords historic photographs of former library sites, giving the viewer a sense of our local Library's evolution since its beginnings in 1876. The Historical Society is located at 426 Highland Avenue, West Dundee, and can be visited Wednesdays and Sundays from 2-4.
