
WRAPPING UP THE YEAR IN REVIEW

Fiscal Year 2002-2003


Here's a sampling of photos from Library programs and events this past calendar year.

Participants of the Rock and Mineral program used microscopes to examine formations.





The Friends of Library appreciate your donation of used books for their on-going book sale! This fall we received countless boxes of books.




