



### SUMMER STORYTIME


Children from preschoolers thru second grade will have fun singing, listening to stories, watching mini-puppet shows and doing fingerplays with a summer flair. No registration.

## **DID YOU KNOW...?**

### **That in Public Libraries In America:**

1. People go to (school, public, and academic) libraries **as often as they go to the movies**.
2. Public libraries are the **number one point of access to the internet** for those without internet connections at home, school, or work.
3. Reference librarians at public and academic libraries **answer more than 7 million questions each week**.
4. **95%** of public libraries provide access to the internet.
5. There are **more than 16,000 public libraries in the United States**.
6. There are **more public libraries in the United States than McDonald's**, including library branches.
7. **91% of Americans expect libraries to be necessary in the future**, despite increased reliability on the internet.
