Notes from the Director

I have just returned from the Public Library Association conference where 11,000 librarians attended programs covering all interests from technology to management.

One of my main reasons in attending was to gather information to work with the Board of Trustees and the staff in achieving the library goals that were outlined at the most recent Board Retreat in March. This includes the purchase of a second book drop to be placed on Randall Road by the start of summer, hosting story times and limited adult programs on the west side beginning in September, replacement of library furniture and the carpeting, a community survey, updating our web page, expanding our outreach efforts and planning for the future of the library.

The closing session speaker was Paco Underhill, author of *Why We Buy: The Science of Shopping*. He described how libraries should pattern themselves after retail establishments in how they market themselves and in merchandising their products. He feels that "Libraries are a critical part of enriching our lives".

A few days after returning to our library, I noticed Grandmother Valerie Thompson taking a picture of her grandchildren, Madison Lukowski and Austin Brunzo (below) as they received their "first" library card. Did you know that we give children an official certificate with their first card?

Mrs. Thompson explained to me that they have been to the library many times but did not have their own cards and "today was their day!" She was able to make the experience of getting their first card a "Kodak moment". I hope that all of you will continue to make the library and our resources an integral part of your lives. 
