Notes from the Director

In this issue, I am pleased to report that the library's feasibility study and environmental scan have been completed and were presented to the Board of Trustees at the June 9th meeting.

The architectural firm of PSA Dewberry was hired to evaluate the structural soundness of our current library building, now more than 34 years old, to predict its life span and to present options needed for future growth.

At the same time, Northern Illinois University completed an environmental scan that projected the demographic growth of our service area and obtained feedback from community members.

In a nutshell, the architectural analysis reports that our current library building can sustain only another five to ten years of successful operation before it may not be cost effective to maintain.

The NIU study projects that by 2030, the population of the library's service area will soar from its current 54,000 residents to a population of more than 88,000.

The Dundee Township Library District now covers the towns of East and West Dundee, Carpentersville, Sleepy Hollow and Gilberts, as well as parts of Algonquin, Elgin and Barrington.

In addition to these two studies by outside parties, the library conducted several internal evaluations this past year, including an in-depth staff utilization study and a SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) analysis.

With these studies in hand, the staff and the Board will continue to work on improving your library. It's exciting to think of the possibilities of what can be done to serve our communities for the future. But we need your input, too.

Your comments will be forwarded to the Board who will begin to discuss future planning at their retreat on July 26 and in future Board meetings.

In this day and age, Jennifer feels that every teacher is faced with the complex challenges of imparting a sense of social responsibility to students.

"Giving back to my community is one reason why I chose to serve on the library's Board," explained the Carpentersville resident.

"I try to teach my students that it is important to get involved, give back to your community, and continue a lifetime of learning."

With roots in a small central Illinois town, there are several teachers in her family, including her father who recently retired from a high school teaching career, and her mother who still works at a local pre-school.

Jennifer has taken on the additional responsibility of being the student council sponsor for her South Barrington school, working with 45 representatives of the 600+ student body.

That includes coordinating activities such as Adopt-A-Family, a School Store, canned food drives, walk-a-thons, and other events to raise funds for worthy causes such as helping out the Henry O. Tanner Elementary School on the south side of Chicago.

In her spare time, you may find her at a Cubs' game or cheering on her favorite drivers at a NASCAR race. Her reading preferences these days include young adult fiction, historical novels and adventure yarns, "but definitely not fantasy."

In fact, in the midst of the Harry Potter craze, she told her students to read what they enjoyed, not "what everyone else was reading."

Blessman shares the concern of other Board members about the library's future growth in an environment of a slowing national economy. Since public libraries receive their operating budgets from a small portion of property taxes, the continuing downward trend of the housing market is not good news.

"Our Board and library staff are continually working on ways to try to meet the increasing demand for our services, especially in growth areas west of the Fox River, but with fixed and limited resources," she said. ■

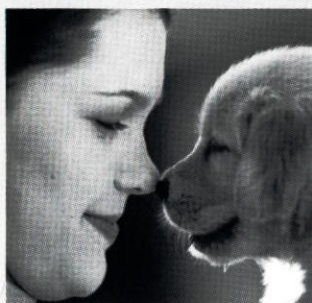
