■ An executive search has begun to replace Elisa Topper, who resigned as director of the Dundee Township Public Library, announced Board of Trustees President Jennifer Blessman.

Topper, who has been the library's director since 2003, left in January to pursue a writing career in the library field.

"We wish Ms. Topper well in her new endeavor and appreciate the many contributions she has made to the Dundee Library over the past five years," said Blessman.

■ The library will offer another new service soon called *E-Pay*, a program through the state of Illinois that will allow our patrons to pay fines by credit card via www.dundeelibrary.info. Cards which will be accepted are American Express, Discover, Master Card and Visa. There will be no additional fees charged for this service, which will be available in mid-March.

■ Patrons may now send their print jobs to the library's printers from home or other remote location by logging in to the library's website. After a job is sent, it can be picked up at the library. A print card must still be purchased. Prices for a full-color printout are \$1 per page; black-and-white copies are \$.10. For more information, visit www.dundeelibrary.info.

Carrie Brecke, Library Trustee

With a son named after Dashiell Hammett, the popular author of detective novels and short stories, it's obvious that Trustee Carrie Brecke has a deep and life-long love of books, reading and words.

The East Dundee resident has found many ways to nurture those passions over the years. As a Dundee Township Public Library trustee for the past decade, Carrie has helped shape the destiny of a library that serves more than 54,000 residents of Dundee Township.

A Roosevelt University faculty member, Carrie is also the Director of Roosevelt's Writing Center, a position that gives her great personal and professional satisfaction. A venture she spearheaded three years ago, it offers writing support for students, faculty and members of the university community--basically, for anyone who would like to become a better writer.

As director, she trains and supervises undergraduate and graduate student tutors who offer help with any writing task, including

academic essays, research papers, proposals, business or professional writing and lab reports

"It's such a positive thing to help people learn how to write," she said. "I feel that we do good things all the time." Carrie also teaches English and Women's and Gender Studies at Roosevelt, adding that her personal philosophy fits in well with Roosevelt's mission of social justice to "change the world to be a better place."

At age 21, Carrie moved to Chicago from Coos Bay, Oregon, to raise her family, including son Dashiell, now 27, and daughter Anika, 24.

At 30, she returned to school, where she received a master's in English studies in 1994 from the University of Illinois at Chicago. She became an adjunct professor there and also at Roosevelt University, where she was asked to create a writing center in 2005.

Though today finds her thousands of miles away from the rugged beauty of the Oregon coast, she did not leave her appreciation and enjoyment of nature behind.

Still an avid camper, hiker and kayaker, she and her long-time friend, Marsha Walker, enjoy the outdoors, and return each year to Coos Bay to reconnect with family.

She's also close to finishing her first novel, a gothic psychological thriller she started writing three years ago. "It's set in an old, spooky house...and that's all I'm going to tell you," she laughed.

She acknowledges that the library is not immune to the ongoing economic crises facing the nation. "We're in a tight spot — we will have less money to do more. While we realize the need to expand both our services and provide adequate space to offer these services, we know we can't pass that on to our taxpayers," she stated.

The challenge will be to maintain the current level of services in creative ways. "Instead of thinking big, we must come up with unique ways to do more and serve our community's needs in better ways," she said.

Transitions are stressful, but positive, she said. "You can't make progress without change. We see this time as an opportunity to grow, re-examine the ways we do things as a part of the vision for the future, and perhaps, become a better library than we have been in the past," she concluded.

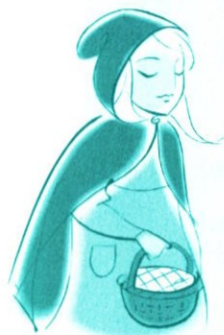

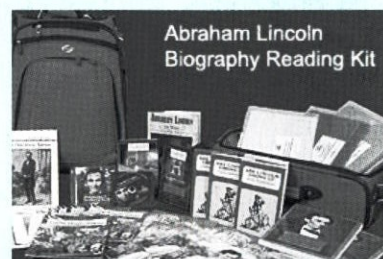
Lincoln Legacy Learning Kits Now Available for Illinois Educators

In 2009, we celebrate the 200th birthday of one of our most beloved presidents, Abraham Lincoln. The Dundee Township Public Library is one of only 40 libraries through out the state that was awarded a set of the Lincoln Legacy Learning Kits, a resource designed to bring the lessons of Lincoln to the children of Illinois.

Available to educators and targeted to grades 5-8, four contained units of study about Lincoln are provided: *Abraham Lincoln Biography Reading Kit*, *Mary Todd Lincoln Kit*, *Civil War Soldiers Kit* and *Slavery in Illinois*.

Created by the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum, each kit contains a teacher resource CD, laminated documents and historic images, reproduction artifacts, music from the time period, and age appropriate books. Each kit will be available for a two-week loan period, and must be checked out in person at the Dundee Township Public Library.

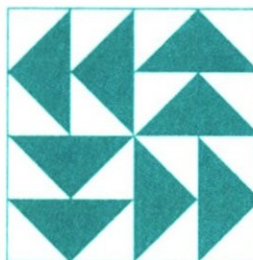
