MAXIMIZE YOUR INVESTMENT

Have you ever wondered how much you would pay **OUT-OF-POCKET** for the library services you use? The **RETURN-ON-INVESTMENT** figure might **SURPRISE** you!

Following is a scenario we might see here at the Dundee Library. A family comes in for a visit. Mom heads down to the meeting room for a computer class while Dad browses the stacks in search of the newest fiction titles and a do-it-yourself home appliance repair book so he can fix the dryer. Their young adult daughter heads to the computers to do some online research for an English paper that is due Friday. Their younger son selects two DVDs to watch over the weekend (and downloads an eBook from the library's web site onto his new Sony Reader when they get home).

This is in addition to a trip to the library earlier this week, when Mom brought their youngest to a craft program with a stop in the Children's Department to check out some chapter books.

Now more than ever, people are looking for ways to make their hard-earned dollars stretch further. The library can help.

The busy family above received \$214 worth of materials and service (see sidebar for breakdown) from the library in a single week. The more they use the library, the more they save. You can learn what your own return-on-investment is by visiting our web site at www.dundeelibrary.info. On the home page you will find a link to the ROI calculator designed by the North Suburban Library Service. Simply enter the number of items or services you and your family use per library visit. Then, click the "Submit" button for a breakdown of the total.

NSLS went to retail stores, booksellers, video stores, and park districts in the community to gather real world prices for books, materials, and programs. And if you're thinking "but I don't get to keep what I check out from the library," look at it this way: what are you really going to do with all of those materials once you've used them, besides let them collect dust on a shelf? The library is the ultimate in recycling! The rest is knowledge, and that is priceless.

So leave your wallet and credit cards at home and come to the Dundee Library for a productive, and profitable, visit.

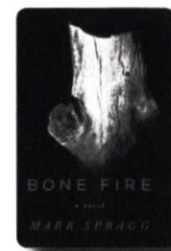

READING PATCH CLUB IS BACK

Kids can wear their love of reading on their sleeve (or their backpack, jeans, or jacket) by participating in the Dundee Library's Reading Patch Club.

The club invites children in preschool through eighth grade to read their favorite books and explore the library for new ones, which earns them patches.

Preschoolers through second graders can earn three patches in the following categories: general-humor, fantasy, and animals. They must read, or have read to them, 20 books in a category to receive a patch.

Third through eighth graders can earn five different patches in: general-humor, fantasy, animals, mystery, and Caudill Awards. They must read ten books in a category to receive a patch.

The Reading Patch Club will end on Saturday, May 29. All the patches are free. Booklists and reading logs are available at the children's desk.

AARP TAX AIDE

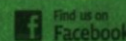
