LIBRARY LAUNCHES FINE FORGIVENESS PROGRAM

Start the new year with a zero balance in your overdue fine account! From January 10 - 23, visit our circulation desk to pay your overdue book fines. Pay half of your balance with cash or check only and we will donate it to the FISH Food Pantry in Carpentersville. The other half of your balance will be forgiven, and forgotten, by the library. It's a great way to clear your account and fill the shelves at the pantry at the same time!

The program covers fines of items checked out from the Dundee Township Public Library District only. Items must be returned at the time of payment. Damaged books, collection/referral fees, and lost materials are not included in this program.

NEW DIRECTOR LOOKING TO LISTEN

Since taking the reins as director in late October, Roxane Bennett has been busy addressing lingering renovation issues, getting to know the staff, and meeting community leaders.



Over the next several months, Roxane will conduct what she calls "listening tours" with key stakeholder groups in the community—gathering feedback about library services and priorities. One thing has been clear in past studies and surveys; the west side of the library district is currently underserved. She is committed to addressing that imbalance.

"The input I gather will help the library develop a plan to meet the needs of the entire district. There are an incredible variety of ways to structure service delivery, and technology keeps expanding those options," she said.

Roxane has called Florida home for the past six years, but she's no stranger here. Her family moved to Elgin in 1968. She spent 21 years in Illinois before moving to Ohio. It was there that she began working in libraries and earned her MLS from Kent State University.

"Hugs from my grandchildren will ward off the shivers," she says when asked about coming back to Chicago winters. With family in South Elgin, Winfield, and Wisconsin, we're certain there will be no shortage of hugs.

The Friends are always in need of volunteers to help sort donated books, assist customers at sales, and participate in fundraising events.




