A DATABASE OF... WELL, DATABASES


Did you know that with your Dundee Library card, you have access to a collection of research databases, free of charge? Many of the Internet's best research databases charge a fee to access their information. The Dundee Library subscribes to more than 30 of these databases, and is able to offer access to library cardholders for free via our web site at dundeelibrary.info.

Our newest offering is Mango Languages, an online language-learning system that teaches actual conversation skills. There are 22 languages to choose from, as well as ESL in 15 different languages.

For **job seekers** there are sites like Hoover's, and Reference USA, which provides detailed company information.



Students find great information for reports and research with access to sites like eLibrary, Facts.com, and World Book Online.



Business professionals find important updates on stocks, mutual funds, and ETFs at sites like Morningstar and Value Line Research Center.



News seekers can search sites like America's Newspapers on Newsbank, Chicago Sun-Times, Chicago Tribune, and Courier-News (all with searchable archives).

Genealogists find answers on searchable sites like America's Genealogy Bank, America's Obituaries and Death Notices, and Heritage Quest.

Fiction readers and kids can find their next read at NoveList and NoveList K-8.

The next time you're in search of information, don't waste precious time scrolling through 14,100,000 "results" or precious dollars with fees. Libraries are where people have always gone to find information. In these changing times, we have found a way to bring that information to you.

AARP TAX-AIDE OFFERS FREE TAX HELP




The Children's Department reminds parents that preschoolers through eighth graders can earn patches by reading 10 books in a specific area such as animals or fantasy.




