WE'VE NAMED OUR FACILITIES; NOW, HELP US RENAME THE LIBRARY DISTRICT

Early this year, we announced our intention to rename the library district and launched a community-wide campaign to solicit ideas for that new name. Thoughtful ideas have been streaming in, and as the deadline for submissions approaches, we'd like to ask for your input one final time...

Suggestions will be evaluated according the following criteria and guidelines:

- The new name must end with the words "Public Library District."
- It must be easy to remember, and easy to say.
- The name must be original; a thorough search will be conducted to ensure the name has not been used by another organization.
- There must be a tie-in to our local community, the geographical region, the State, a significant historic feature, or a predominant physical feature of the surrounding area (lakes, rivers, creeks, etc.)
- This will be the legal name of the library district, and the one under which we do business.
- The name must be marketable and have mass appeal. It will be used both in print and electronically.
- The Dundee Library currently serves residents of Carpentersville, East Dundee, West Dundee, Sleepy Hollow, and Gilberts, as well as parts of Algonquin, Elgin and Barrington Hills.

Submission of Suggestions

Residents (all ages) and employees of the library are welcome to participate. Suggestions may be submitted electronically or on paper and must include the creator's full name, mailing address and phone number. They must be received by 9 p.m. on Friday, March 2. Please be aware that with your submission you hereby grant to the Dundee Township Public Library District a royalty-free right and license to use, display, modify, reproduce, publish, and distribute your submission.
