DUNDEE LIBRARY WINS \$10,000 IN BOOKS!

In November, staff and patrons at the Dundee Library were thrilled to learn that we were the winner of \$10,000 in books through the "Soar With Reading" program, sponsored and run by JetBlue Airways, PBS KIDS, and Random House Children's Books. This nationwide program was developed to encourage children to read over the summer.

In addition to the reading program there were incentive sweepstakes to encourage participation. To enter, participants nominated their local libraries to win the \$10,000 grand prize. More than 115,000 entries were received representing libraries in all 50 states.

To celebrate this imaginative program and generous award, the public jam-packed the library's meeting room for a special storytime featuring PBS KIDS celebrities Mr. Steve, Hooper, and Super Why!, and children's author David Carter who read from his book *Lots of Bots*.

"We are thrilled to accept the generous sweepstakes prize from JetBlue Airways and their partners PBS KIDS and Random House Books. These books will go a long way in delighting our youngest patrons," said Roxane Bennett, library director. "We are very proud to be associated with an organization that puts a high value on books, and then acts on those values through an extensive initiative to encourage children to read. Reading can open up the world to a child, much like an airplane can. Children are much more likely to soar when presented with the opportunity and tools to do so."
