FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK

In mid-November, we conducted an in-person patron survey at both of our locations for a week. Nearly 500 people participated and the results are in!

About three-quarters of our users have very positive opinions of the library in general and another 20 percent have somewhat positive opinions. Over 95 percent give staff high marks for customer service. However, responses to detailed questions about services such as collections, programs, and hours reveal that users are not satisfied with the current level of those services. Our users at both locations are looking for improvement in the most basic of library services — more books, more movies, and more programs — along with additional hours of operation.

Eighty percent of the people who visit both locations borrow print books, and seventy percent borrow DVDs, yet just over half of Dundee patrons and one quarter of Randall Oaks patrons rank the selection in these core collections as extremely good.

At Randall Oaks, 72 percent of users have children under 18, but only half rate the collection of children's books highly, and only one third are satisfied with the children's programs. More than two-thirds would like to see increased hours of operation for the branch.

At the Dundee Library, feedback shows the need for parking improvements, more programs and classes for adults, and the addition of innovative services such as maker spaces and robotics programs.

With the survey results as a guide, we will continue tweaking services to address your priorities as best we can with current resources. However, significant increases in programming, collections, and library hours will require additional space and staff, which, in turn, requires additional funding.



CHALLENGES:

- **OUR LIBRARY'S TAX RATE IS 1/3 THAT OF NEIGHBORING LIBRARY DISTRICTS SUCH AS ALGONQUIN AND ELGIN.**
- **OUR TWO FACILITIES COMBINED PROVIDE LESS THAN HALF THE LIBRARY SPACE RECOMMENDED FOR THE NEARLY 70,000 RESIDENTS LIVING IN OUR SERVICE AREA.**

As we develop plans to address district funding and space challenges, we'll be coming back to you for more input via surveys and focus groups.
