Sylvia has resided in Roselle for ten years, but is considering relocating to Dundee Township. She is impressed by the "homey feeling" here and the friendliness of the people. "It's a growing, flourishing area," she observes.

During her off time, Sylvia enjoys reading. (Surprised?) She also "loves to sing" and is fond of "outdoor things" like fairs and ball parks. Traveling and eating out also rate as favorite pastimes. 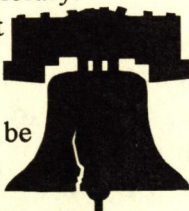

## HAVE VAN; WILL TRAVEL

Have you ever needed a book *not* among the more than 100,000 volumes available at the Dundee Library? It may be possible to obtain it for you through a service called Inter-library Loan (ILL). Although on the surface it sounds as simple as one library putting the book on a van and another library taking it off, the process can be a bit more complicated.

Outlining the dos & don'ts is **Elizabeth Mavros**, ILL coordinator:

- ILL service is for holders of Dundee Library cards only.
- A patron may request no more than 5 items at a time.
- Material newer than 6 mos. old (approx.) is not obtainable.
- A library may be unwilling or unable to loan a particular item. (The needs of local patrons take precedence.)
- Some materials (such as rare genealogy items) are for in-library use only.
- The library which supplies the book imposes the date due. (It may or may not be the same loan period as ours.)
- Overdue fines are charged at twice the regular rate.
- Renewals are not always possible.
- There is no way to determine when an item will arrive, since it may already be checked out (or even overdue) at the lending library.
- Patrons will be called when their material is ready for pick-up.
- Material not checked out within 4 days will be rerouted to the library of origin.

A bit of trivia: An average of 200 ILL items arrive each month for Dundee Library patrons. They come from everywhere, even places like Denmark and Canada. Some are written in foreign languages, such as Chinese and Farsi.

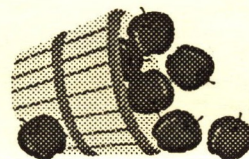
