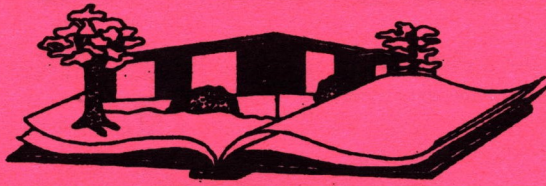

We installed the new Public Access Terminals (PACS) and had a wonderful week celebrating our library during National Library Week. We received ninety-nine responses to the survey that was in the Spring Newsletter. It was nice to find that overall you were very pleased with the library. Many of you asked for more books on tape, more computers and more new books. In the coming months we will work to increase our books on tape collection and we will be adding new shelving to increase the size of the new books section. We will also focus on weeding the current collection.

Over the past few months we have started an Adult Reading Club and had an author visit the library as you suggested. We are pleased that the response to these programs has been very good. I am sure that you will continue to enjoy the library this summer as you take advantage of our first Adult Summer Reading Program!

Finally, starting June 1st the outside book drop will be open during the day. We hope that this will make returning materials easier for you. Have a great summer with us here at the library. Thank you for letting us know how we can serve you better!

NEW COMPUTERIZED CARD CATALOGS ARRIVE

Recent visitors to the Dundee Library are taking notice of the six new computerized card catalog work stations for the public. Patrons start from a user-friendly screen to search for books, videos, CDs and cassettes by author, title, or subject. Can't remember that title? The computer makes it easy to find by allowing a search by any word or words you might remember. And you don't even have to type them in order! You can even do a "Quick Search" by typing a combination of the author's last name and part of the title.

Other benefits of the new system include showing if a book is on the shelf, what the due date is if it is checked out, and how many reserves are on the title. It will also show which of the other 23 libraries in the library system have the materials. Improvements will be coming this summer that include easier searching and patron-placed reserves for the materials they need.



The traditional card catalog will still be available but will not be kept current. The adult and children's librarians are always available to assist patrons who need help.
