ADULT SUMMER READING PROGRAM

The theme of this year's Adult Summer Reading program is **BOOKS THAT HAVE BEEN MADE INTO MOVIES**. By completing just one Book Log of four adult library books including one that has been made into a movie, patrons qualify to enter the drawing for one of four Grand Prizes, "An Evening of Entertainment." The prize package includes a gift certificate to a restaurant, two movie passes, a video movie guide and assorted munchies to eat at the theater.

Tickets to concerts at Ravinia, pens and bookmarks will be also given away as patrons turn in their Book Logs. Last year, the 109 participants in the program read 636 books.

"The expanding dimensions of libraries over the last few years have been tremendous. It's been exciting to be part of that," said Mrs. Kotleba.


She was presented with a pair of engraved sewing shears by her fellow Board members and a clock from the library staff in honor of her service to the library.


