

ADULT FICTION

BLUE LIGHT by Walter Mosley. In a departure from his Easy Rawlins series, this is the story of people transformed for the better by a blue light that strikes the earth from outer space.

THE POISONWOOD BIBLE by Barbara Kingsolver. Postcolonial Belgian Congo is the setting for the story of a Baptist evangelist and his family.

MANNEQUIN by J. Robert James. A French detective and a Gestapo officer are teamed in Paris of 1942 to solve a murder and a bank robbery.

AIRS AND GRACES by Erica James. A young divorcee plans for a new life are interrupted by Jo-Jo, a homeless pregnant girl, and Matthew, a traveling artist.

ADULT NON-FICTION

THE HIRED MAN'S CHRISTMAS by George Givens. A mysterious hired hand teaches the author the importance of family and love.

CHRISTMAS ON JANE STREET: A TRUE STORY by Billy Romp. In a unique, real-life Christmas story, the author describes his travels from Vermont to Manhattan to sell Christmas trees from his camper.

LAS CHRISTMAS: FAVORITE LATINO AUTHORS SHARE THEIR HOLIDAY MEMORIES by Esmerelda Santiago and Joie Davidow. 24 distinguished Latino authors share reminiscences and reflections on the Christmas holidays.

BEST CHRISTMAS EVER by Pamela Westland. A glorious collection of festive ideas and traditions includes ideas for decorating the home, ornaments, cards and recipes.




