❖ *new services***PLACE YOUR OWN INTERLIBRARY LOANS**

Starting June 1st, Dundee Library patrons will be able to request books from other libraries directly from the computer catalog. To order a book you must have a valid Dundee Library Card number and you must order it from one of the computers within the Dundee Library. We will call you as soon as the book arrives. Some materials such as new books, videos, and reference materials cannot be borrowed, but you may suggest we purchase these items. For more information, see the reference librarian.

To reserve or request a title call the adult reference desk at 428-3661 ext. 208. ADULT SUMMER READING PROGRAM

The theme of this year's Adult Summer Reading Program is "Step Back in Time". By completing just one Book Log of **four** adult library books including one historical book, patrons qualify to enter the drawing for the grand prize or one of two secondary prizes. The historical selection may be fiction or non-fiction and can be set in any historical age except the 1980's or 1990's. An unlimited number of completed Book Logs can be submitted for the drawing. The Grand Prize is two nights for two at the **Park Avenue Guest House** in Galena, Illinois. The **Park Avenue Guest House** is an 1893 Queen Anne style "Painted Lady" that features 4 guestrooms, antique decor, full breakfasts, extensive gardens and two parlors. Two additional drawings will be held for copies of **DUNDEE TOWNSHIP, 1835 - 1985**, a 352 page history of the area compiled by the Dundee Township Historical Society.

Ravinia tickets, book marks and library pencils will also be given away as supplies last to patrons turning in their book logs. Last years participants read a total of 836 books.

For additional information and to register for the program, stop at the Reference Desk and present your Dundee Township Library card. Book Logs can be picked up beginning Monday, June 7 and must be completed and turned in by Saturday, August 14. Winners will be notified by phone after the drawing on Monday, August 16.






