




❖ *reserving books over the internet***GETTING IN LINE--ONLINE**

**C**an't wait to reserve the new John Grisham or Danielle Steel? Now you can place reserves directly from your home computer just like you do from our Library Catalogs. Go to our library homepage at [www.northstarnet.org/dukhome/DundeePL](http://www.northstarnet.org/dukhome/DundeePL). Click on Library catalog to telnet to our computer. Login as **dukje3a**. Password is the 2nd through 5th numbers on your Library Card. For more information call the Reference Desk at 428-3661 ext. 208.

1. Find the book you want and press **C** key to show call number. If checked out at Dundee press the **L** key.
2. Enter your complete Dundee Library Card Number. Press the **Enter** key.
3. Type the password "patron" in small letters. Press the **Enter** key.
4. If the screen is correct, press the **L** key.
5. Look for "Hold successfully added." Press **F1** twice to start over.


