So what is proper identification?

The most efficient is a photo ID with your current address, such as a driver's license or state ID. If your photo ID does not have your current address, a second ID with your current address is needed, such as a piece of mail.

Once baked, polymer clay is very hard and can be painted with acrylic paints or sealed with a clear finish. Finished charms can be attached to keychains or necklaces. UV resin is a quick and easy way to add a glossy protective layer to finished pieces and shrink charms. Simply brush on and allow to cure for a few minutes under the special UV light. Grades 6-12.

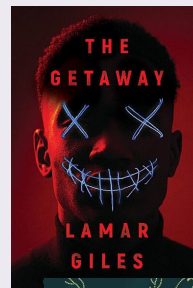

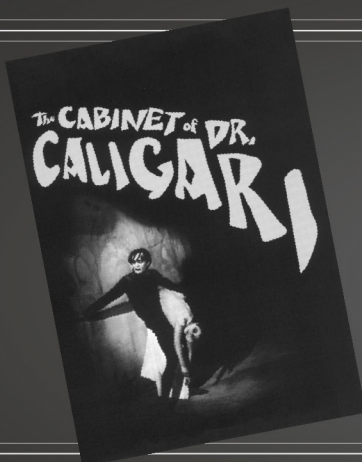
