AUTOMATION UPGRADES WILL IMPROVE CIRCULATION THROUGHOUT THE LIBRARY

Ground broke this summer on Randall Road as construction began on the new park district building, which will also house our library branch. As construction crews descended on the site, plans to streamline the flow at our main location were laid out as well. As we spread our staff to the branch, making our main location more efficient and self-sufficient will help us provide the best service to the entire district at both locations. Here is what you will see this fall:

Self Check-Out Stations. Three new 3M self-check stations, which can process all library materials, will take the place of the older self-check. Two units will be located on the main level; one will be located on the lower level. Patrons with a library card can whisk through with a quick library card scan and check out materials and print or email due dates themselves. Library bills can be paid with a credit card or a library card (did you know you can deposit funds into your library account to pay for scans, copies, fines, etc.?).

Automated Returns. Two ATM-like book returns, complete with sorting bins and conveyor belts, will be installed in the circulation area. You can email a receipt to yourself for returned materials.

Brief Closure. The library will be closed to the public for two days as the circulation area is re-configured and the staff is trained on the new equipment. We anticipate the closure dates to be Thursday, Sept. 22 and Friday, Sept. 23. We will reopen on Saturday, Sept. 24.

Self Service Holds. When we reopen, patrons can pick up materials they have placed on hold themselves. The Self-Service Hold Area will replace the book sale area just inside the front door. Labels will identify the patron's name while concealing the book title. Held items can only be checked out to the card used to place the hold

The friendly faces you're used to seeing at the Circulation Desk will be available to assist as needed with holds, check-outs, and returns. Special thanks to staff and volunteers who touched every item in the library in order to affix an RFID (Radio Frequency Identification) tag! As you can see, there is a lot going on at the Dundee Library — and there is even more to come!
