BRANCHING OUT TO THE WEST SIDE

A branch library is coming to the west side of Dundee Township Public Library District! The branch will be housed on the lower level of the new Randall Oaks Recreation Center being built by the Dundee Township Park District on Randall Road north of Rt. 72.

Currently projected to open in the fall of 2012, the 5,000 square foot library space will feature popular materials such as children's books, new fiction, hot-topic non-fiction, and recent DVD releases. Programs and public computers will also be offered. A drive-up book drop will be installed near the entryway.

We are committed to providing equitable services to all district residents. The Dundee Library's service area goes well beyond Dundee Township boundaries, encompassing nearly one-third of Rutland Township including all of the Village of Gilberts. Since 2000, our population has grown from approximately 54,000 to over 72,000. Most of that growth has occurred west of Rt. 31, straining area roads and increasing travel times across the two bridges spanning the Fox River.

The growth of the last 10 years has placed a large burden on the taxpayers of our neighboring library district in Algonquin as residents flocked to the Algonquin Library on Harnish Road seeking convenient service. In January 2011, one-third of Algonquin's circulation was to Dundee Library cardholders whose property tax dollars do not pay for Algonquin Library services. As a result, new borrowing restrictions on out-of-district users are scheduled to be implemented by Algonquin in September 2011.

As the economy recovers, growth will resume. Surveys conducted by the library in 2008 and 2010 showed resident support for library service locations on both sides of the Fox River. Partnering with the park district to lease space for a small branch inside their facility is the most cost-effective way for the library to provide more equitable service to our west-side taxpayers in the short run, and gives us time to plan for the future.

Over the next few months, new technology will be put in place at the main library to free up staff hours that will ultimately be shifted to the branch. New automated check-out and return stations will handle all types of material. We'll even have a check-out machine in the children's area on the lower level, reducing lines and wait time for busy families.
