INTRODUCING THREE NEW E-RESOURCES FREE FOR FRVPLD CARDHOLDERS

Hoopla is a digital media platform that allows you to stream movies and TV shows. It also has eComics, eBooks, eAudiobooks, and music available.



Cardholders can borrow up to five items every month per library card. The items are available instantaneously — no checkouts, holds, or waiting lists. A mobile app is available for Apple, Android, and Amazon devices and items can be downloaded for viewing offline. The collections in Hoopla have content available for patrons of any age.

User tip: Register all of the library cards in your household to maximize your monthly borrows.

Brainfuse provides homework help, test prep resources, help with job searching and resume



building. It is especially helpful for students in grades K-12, teens preparing for college, adult learners looking to continue their education, and job seekers. One of the most exciting features is the live online tutoring. Tutors are available from 2 to 11 p.m. (CDT), seven days a week and can help with any subject area in any grade level. Live job coaches are available as well to help with job searching, resumes, and job interviews.

User tip: Create a free account to access more great features like online study groups, flashcards, and review games.

Pronunciator is a language learning platform with 80 different languages.



Structured, eight-week courses are available, as well as open, more casual options — whichever works with how you learn best. Users learn languages and culture through images, videos, music, poetry and more. Lessons and courses geared towards children make it appropriate for any age. It also has robust ESL content for 51 different languages that includes a U.S. Citizenship course.

User tip: Get live help from an expert language tutor by clicking on ProLive. Be sure to check out "Words on the Street" in every language.

All of these new resources can be found on the library's website at www.frvpld.info under the "Research" tab. Brainfuse and Pronunciator can be used in the library or at home with your library card number. You must have a library card to access Hoopla. See page 9 for a list of classes where you can learn how to get the most out of these powerful online tools.

DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

Whew! What a busy summer we had here at FRVPLD! Sign-ups for our Summer Reading Challenge hit 2,375 — more than any previous year in our history! As I write this message, we're on track to break records for the number of "finishers," too.

But we don't really need numbers to tell us that the library is a major community gathering space. A walk through our buildings this summer made it clear. The walls rang with the sound of kids running in ahead of their parents, out of breath after playing in Wahoo Woods. Both parents and kids found a place to cool off, meet new friends, create something, and check out a book or two to take home. Teens got creative at ten different crafting programs. Busy adults buzzed in and out to pick up their holds and take care of business on the computers. We also saw lots of new faces at our summer lunch program, many of whom came early or stayed afterwards to read and play.

Back to School

By now, those of you with school-age children are getting back into your school routine. We hope you include weekly library visits as part of that routine and ensure that each student has a library card. Even if it's one of those late night research projects or a math problem that's got your student stumped, the library can help. In mid-August, we rolled out a new eResource called Brainfuse which provides live tutors for real time help and answers.

Out in the Community

We continue to seek out pockets of need in the community to address with outreach services. This fall's schedule includes: visits to many of our schools, storytimes at the Jerri Hoffman Child and Family Center and Panera Bread, children's programs in Wahoo Woods, an adult program at the Village Green 55+ Community, and a computer program at the Dundee Township Adult Activities Center.

The Library at Home

We serve patrons right from their own homes as well. At FRVPLD, we've provided materials to download such as books, audiobooks, and music for a number of years, as well as online subscriptions to services such as Consumer Reports and PebbleGo. Starting this month, we are thrilled to add video to that through a new eResource, Hoopla. With your library card, you can stream or download movies, TV shows, and a number of other digital items. The RESEARCH section of our website presents many other trusted research resources that can help you find a job or a college, invest with confidence or start a new business, learn to drive or improve your skills to get a better job, track your ancestors or find out what that antique bureau your Aunt Betty left you is worth. Your library card is the ticket to a world of resources without a "pay wall" or subscription fee.

Please visit us, however it is convenient for you...within our walls, on the road, at home, or wherever you find yourself with a device in your hand.

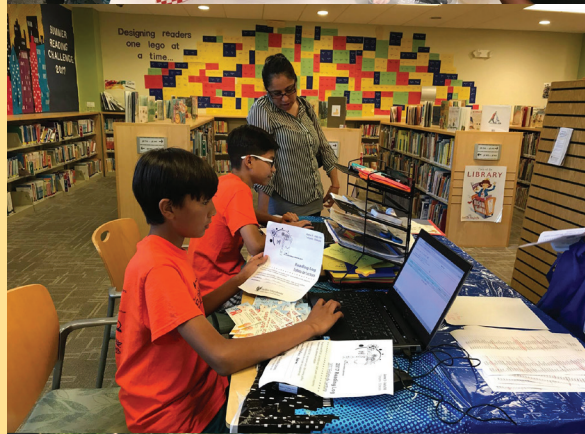
