lynda.com is an online learning site that hosts a constantly growing library of over 3,000 courses that include over 130,000 videos. Courses cover a variety of topics (including business, design, web development and multimedia skills) and software (Microsoft Office, Adobe Creative Suite and

open source applications) that can help you pursue personal and professional goals. These courses are delivered by expert instructors and feature searchable transcripts that make it easy to find quick answers to questions. They also feature Certificates of Completion that can be uploaded to a LinkedIn profile.

Normally, using lynda.com requires a paid subscription, but as an FRVPLD library cardholder you can access lynda.com content from any computer with an Internet connection with your library card number. Find lynda.com at www.frvpld.info. It is located in the "Research" tab.

Kids InfoBits research database arrives just in time for back to school





DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

A LIBRARY CARD PROVIDES ENDLESS OPPORTUNITIES TO TRANSFORM THE SCHOOL YEAR



As students head back to school, there is one essential school supply that requires no shopping and doesn't cost a penny – it's a library card.

This September, FRVPLD is joining with the American Library Association (ALA) and libraries nationwide for Library Card Sign-up Month, to encourage parents, caregivers and students to obtain a free library card that will save them money while reaping rewards in academic achievement and lifelong learning.

Libraries play an important role in the education and development of children. Studies show children who are read to in the home and who use the library perform better in school and are more likely to continue to use the library as a source of lifetime learning.

Page through this newsletter and you will see evidence of the programs and services we provide to promote learning at any age. The Youth Services Department has added a new After School S.T.E.A.M. program for Grades K-6 (see page 5). Teen programs are as diverse as teens themselves - choose from anime, poetry, gaming and zombies to name a few (see page 7). New for adults are monthly "Civic Conversations" facilitated by popular discussion leader Gary Midkiff. All adults are invited to participate in respectful conversation about current events such as foreign policy, November elections, and immigration (see page 9).

Society is changing in the way it consumes information. Libraries are

evolving with these changes to serve the public and to continue to fulfill their role in leveling the playing field for all who seek information and access to technologies.

Today's public libraries are thriving technology hubs that millions rely on as their first or only choice for Internet access and digital content. In addition to books, magazines, DVDs, computers, games, software and other multimedia materials, libraries provide access to e-books, e-book readers, laptops, and mobile hotspots.

This year, Disney's The Incredibles are Library Card Sign-up Month honorary chairs, helping to promote the value of a library card and bring attention to the many ways libraries and librarians transform lives and communities through education. We are excited to join in the fun! Anyone who signs up for a library card in September will receive an Incredibles bookmark, and a special Mr. Incredible sticker that proclaims "I Got a Library Card Today!"

Also during the month of September, we will have a link on our home page to a library value calculator where you can see just how using your library card saves you real dollars.

Often the library is the first point of contact in helping community members. From providing assistance to small business owners to assisting with access to e-government resources, libraries are changing lives through education. Libraries are America's great information equalizers – the only place

Fox River Valley Public Library District Trustee Marge Skold retired from the Library Board, effective Aug. 1. Ms. Skold joined the board in 2007. During her tenure, she served as Board President, Vice President, and was liaison in various roles including physical facilities,



personnel, and policy. Before her role on the board, she was a member of the Friends of the Library.

Over the course of eleven years, Ms. Skold played an important role in the library district's forward progress. As president, she presided over long-range plans, including library expansion, due diligence in potential land acquisition for a permanent west side facility, renovation planning for the east side facility, re-naming the library district, and selection of a new library logo.

Upon announcement of her retirement, Ms. Skold reflected back on the value of libraries that led her to serve in this voluntary role for so many years.

"Our public libraries are places for learning that go beyond books. They provide pleasure and entertainment along with expanding technology and support for business, government, schools, and individuals. I have lived and worked many places and always the public libraries have stood as testaments to the quality of life in the community. I am proud of how FRVPLD has evolved during the 15 years I have been a part of this community. Individuals, businesses, schools, etc. can look at our library and know that the quality of life is good in the Fox River Valley. Our library can hold its head high. It is a beacon of leadership and continuous learning," said Skold.






