LIBRARY BOOK DROP NOW AVAILABLE IN GILBERTS



To better serve our residents on the far west side of the district, a library book drop has been placed at the Gilberts Village Hall located at 87 Galligan Road. The book drops at Culver's in Carpentersville and Jewel in West Dundee have been permanently removed. The library asks that laptop computers, Youth Services Kits, and hot spots be returned in person at either library. Book donations are not being accepted at this time.

HOME DELIVERY IS HERE TO STAY

Home delivery service will remain a permanent service for patrons in the district. Library card holders can place items on hold and have them delivered to their front door. Please note our new procedure: Once you have placed your item(s) on hold, select "Fox River Valley - Home Delivery" from the library pickup drop down menu. Once an item on hold is ready, you will receive a notice, via your preferred notification method, that your item will be delivered. Items can take 1-2 weeks for delivery, and certain items - hotspots, laptops, and youth kits - are ineligible for home delivery. FOCUSING ON WHAT WE CAN DO

Yes, these are unprecedented and challenging times. Routines have been interrupted. We've all had to rethink what we do, and how we do it. It is frustrating and confusing. But as we navigate our way through to solutions, it also forces us to create new ways to do things, that sometimes turn out to be even better. Here at FRVPLD we've decided to keep one eye on guidelines, recommendations, and forecasts for the future, and the other focused firmly on what we *can* do right now.

For the past three summers, we have distributed free lunches to children in the meeting room at the Dundee Library. Due to social distancing recommendations, this year we provided the lunches curbside, as well as from the back of the library van at the Fox View and Meadowdale Apartment complexes in Carpentersville. We gave out 12,108 breakfasts and lunches, more than any other summer.

Back in April when our doors were closed, we started Home Delivery service so patrons could still get library materials. Since then, we've made more than 900 deliveries and the service is now a permanent option for those who wish to limit their public interactions or just find it more convenient.

While our buildings are now open for browse, grab and go-types of visits, our public computer areas are closed to avoid social distancing and gathering risks. To support households with no or unreliable internet access, we added 28 additional hotspots to the collection (we now have 50!), and extended the check out period from one week to two weeks.

Staff members who create our quality programming got up to speed quickly on how to use Zoom and YouTube to continue connecting with patrons. Storytimes, craft programs, book clubs, and fun interactive trivia programs have been popular. With the announcement of remote eLearning for our students, we quickly added "Homeschooling 101" and "Learning Effectively From Home." As you will see in the following pages, programmers have taken it to the next level with creative, engaging, and educational opportunities.

As we head into the new school year, we've got our eye on how we can further support teachers and students in a new learning landscape. Please keep track of us on social media, and be sure you are subscribed to our weekly digital newsletter for all the latest news and updates from your library.

INTERESTED IN BECOMING A LIBRARY TRUSTEE?

Four seats on the Fox River Valley Public Library District Board of Trustees are up for election in the April 6, 2021 Consolidated Election. Nominating petitions are circulated beginning September 22, 2020 and filed December 14-21, 2020. Term of office: 4 years. By Illinois law, Library District Trustees serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed from district funds for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of duties.

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Prepare for and attend monthly board meetings and ensure that accurate records are maintained.
- Review and approve annual budgets, appropriation, and tax levy.
- Establish and revise library policies.
- Provide the greatest benefit possible to the greatest number of library district residents and taxpayers.
- Conduct long range planning for library services in the context of established standards of service.
- Oversee maintenance of library facilities and plan for replacement or expansion as needed.
- Comply with all federal, state and local laws pertaining to library districts and their officials.

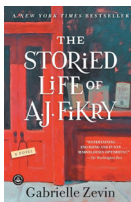

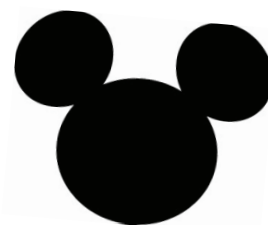
