GET YOUR LICENSE PLATE RENEWAL STICKER AT THE DUNDEE LIBRARY

NO NEED TO DASH TO THE DMV FOR A LAST MINUTE STICKER

The Dundee Library now offers Illinois License Plate renewal service. The new service is an effort to increase value-added, revenue-based service. Illinois residents can walk into the Dundee Library and walk out with their new sticker immediately.



A standard renewal sticker costs \$151, a renewal sticker for a personalized plate

costs \$158, and a renewal sticker for a vanity plate costs \$164.

Like local check-cashing businesses, there will be an additional \$7.50 processing fee. Customers can pay with cash, debit or credit card. You will need your Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) and your license plate number.

FRVPLD is the first library in Illinois to offer this service. We expect to generate about \$500 a month with this new service. The service will not be available at the Randall Oaks Library. If your vehicle needs to pass an emissions test, we will be unable to renew your license plate.

America's libraries are the ideal partner to assist in the census

The U.S. Constitution requires that a count is taken of America's population every ten years. The first census was directed by Thomas Jefferson in 1790, and though methods of counting have changed drastically since, the goal of the massive undertaking is the same...to allocate resources.

In 2020, this population and housing count of all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the Island Areas will inform very important decisions for the next ten years. The census determines how many representatives each state gets in Congress and is used to redraw district boundaries. Federal agencies use the data to distribute more than \$675 billion in federal funds each year. Locally, we rely on census statistics to plan for new roads, schools, and emergency services and businesses use the data to decide where to open new locations.

For these reasons, it is very important for all us here in Illinois to be counted. Our state has lost population for six straight years, jeopardizing our funding, representation, and growth.

For the first time in census history, residents will be able to respond online, by phone, or by mail. Online access will make it easier for most residents to participate, but according to the Federal Communications Commission, there are more than 24 million Americans who do not have high-speed internet at home. Older adults, rural residents, racial minorities, and those with lower levels of education and income are less likely to have home broadband.

The American Library Association notes that America's libraries are the ideal partner to assist in the census. We are the leading source of no-fee public access to the internet, Wi-Fi, computers and other devices, and technology training. With the response to the 2020 Census designed to take place primarily online, libraries can bridge the digital divide and support a more complete count. ALA has provided an abundance of information and guidance to help us support this important national effort.

Here at FRVPLD, we have set up computer stations dedicated to the 2020 census. At the Dundee Library, two computers will provide access to the census; one in English and one in Spanish. At the Randall Oaks Library, there will be one station available. Starting in mid-March, nearly every household in America will receive an invitation to participate. While staff cannot help patrons answer the questions, if you bring your invitation to the library we will assist in accessing the form online.

When it comes to the 2020 census, you can count on your library to help.

Your information is protected by law. The law requires the Census Bureau to keep your information confidential and use your responses only to produce statistics. They cannot publicly release your responses in any way that could identify you. They will never share your information with immigration enforcement agencies such as ICE, law enforcement agencies such as the FBI or police, or allow it to be used to determine your eligibility for government benefits.

Census Day is April 1! Respondents do not have to wait until April 1 to respond but should include everyone who will be a "usual resident" on April 1, or anyone staying there on April 1 who does not have a usual home elsewhere.

There will be **NO question asking if a respondent is a U.S. citizen** in the 2020 Census.

Be on the lookout for **fraud and scams** during this time. The Census Bureau will not email or text people, and it will not ask for a bank or credit card number, Social Security Number, or payment or donation.

The online form will be available in **English** and 12 non-English languages: Arabic, Chinese (Simplified), French, Haitian Creole, Japanese, Korean, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Tagalog, and Vietnamese. The printed form will be available in English and Spanish.



FREE SUMMER LUNCHES AT THE DUNDEE LIBRARY




