2021 SUMMER READING CHALLENGE READING COLORS YOUR WORLD! JUNE 1 - JULY 31

It's our favorite season -- summer reading! This year's theme focuses on colors and the many ways that reading can expand your world through kindness, growth, and community. We hope you will be encouraged to get creative, try new things, explore art, and find beauty in diversity.

National research finds that **students who participate in library summer reading programs scored higher on reading achievement tests at the beginning of the next school year than those who did not participate.** The mission of a summer reading challenge is to provide students with the tools to bridge this summer gap, while inspiring literacy and life-long learning in readers of all ages.

The broad motif of this year's "colors" theme provides a context for exploring humanity, nature, culture, and science. As you will see in the following pages, we've used that palette of topics to develop programming that demonstrates how **libraries and reading can expand your world.**

The 2021 summer reading challenge will be offered using the online platform Beanstack. Participants earn badges by reading and completing activities. It is available using a web browser or as an easy, fun to use app for all mobile devices. Patrons can also register at the library and keep track of their progress with a paper log. Here is this year's challenge:

Reading Badges: Earn a reading badge for every two hours you read. Collect all the reading badges in your age category to earn your finisher book prize.

Bonus Activity Badges: Activity badges are fun challenges that will help you learn, explore, and try new things! Each activity badge earns you a chance in our bonus prize drawings. The more you collect, the more chances you have to win!

Keep an eye on our blogs and social media channels so you don't miss a thing this summer! If you have participated in past reading challenges using Beanstack, just log in to your account and sign up for this new challenge.

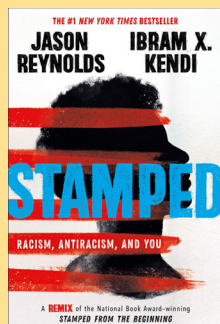

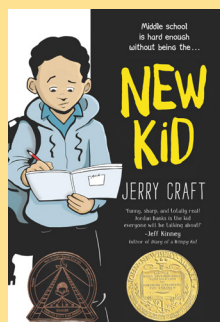

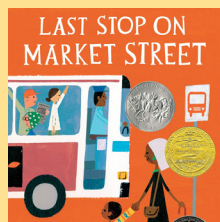
The construct of race has always been used to gain and keep power, to create dynamics that separate and silence. Racist ideas are woven into the fabric of this country, and the first step to building an antiracist America is acknowledging America's racist past and present.

This book takes you on this journey, showing how racist ideas started and were spread, and how they can be discredited.



Seventh grader Jordan Banks loves nothing more than drawing cartoons about his life. But instead of sending him to the art school of his dreams, his parents enroll him in a prestigious private school known for its academics, where Jordan turns out to be one of the few kids of

color in his entire grade. As he makes the daily trip from his Washington Heights apartment to the upscale Riverdale Academy Day School, Jordan soon finds himself torn between two worlds—and not really fitting into either one. Middle school's hard enough without all the unspoken rules and expectations that come with being the new kid! Can Jordan learn to navigate his new school culture while keeping his neighborhood friends and staying true to himself?



On Sundays, CJ and his nana ride the bus across town to their stop on Market Street. But today, CJ's not happy about it. Today, he's wondering out loud why they have to wait in the rain and why they

don't have a car like his other friends. But it's Nana who opens young CJ's eyes and shows him the real beauty in the world around them—the spirit of the bustling city, the music in everyday life, and the magic of their often overlooked neighbors.



One Book, One District FRVPLD 2021

We are pleased to announce the featured title in our second annual One Book, One District community read. The 2021 title is *Stamped: Racism, Antiracism, and You* by Jason Reynolds and Ibram X. Kendi.

The purpose of this reading program is to promote the value of reading and encourage dialogue amongst family, friends, and neighbors to strengthen community identity, unity, and understanding.

Stamped was chosen to address the issue of social justice and start conversations about how community members can take positive steps toward change. Through a gripping, face-paced, and energizing narrative, *Stamped* shines a light on the many insidious forms of racist ideas – and on ways you can identify and stamp out racist thoughts, leading to a better future.

There will be two opportunities to be part of a respectful dialogue with fellow readers this summer. The Senior Center Book Club will discuss it at their meeting on June 2, and the Dundee Library Book Club will do the same on June 30 (see page 9). Summer Reading Challenge participants will earn an activity badge by reading or listening to the book, attending a book club discussion, or attending a related virtual program, “Juneteenth: Past, Present, and Future” on June 19 (see page 8). Juneteenth is the oldest nationally celebrated commemoration of the ending of slavery in the United States.

For our younger readers, two award-winning titles have been chosen for their relevance and acclaim.

New Kid by Jerry Craft is a winner of the Newbery Medal, Coretta Scott King Author Award, and Kirkus Prize for Young Readers' Literature. It is a timely, honest graphic novel about starting over at a new school where diversity is low and the struggle to fit in is real. Students in Grades 3-6 can get in on a discussion at “Between the Panels” on July 15 (see page 6). Summer Reading Challenge participants will earn an activity badge by reading or listening to the book or attending a book club discussion.

Last Stop on Market Street by Matt de la Paña received the Newbery Medal in 2020 and was on the list of Notable Books for a Global Society and the ALA Notable Children's Books in 2016. In this picture book, a young boy rides the bus across town with his grandmother and learns to appreciate the beauty in everyday things.

Fill out an easy online form to tell us about your interests, and a professional librarian will choose materials just for you! Your Fox Picks will be already checked out to you and packaged up in a special bag with your name on it. Here's how it works:

First you'll fill out our Fox Picks Form (www.frvpld.info/foxpicks). You will need your library card number. You will let us know if you want books for an adult, teen or child, and if you'd like to pick up your Fox Picks at the Dundee Library or Randall Oaks Library (you can even select Home Delivery and we'll drop them off at your front door!). You can tell us your preferred reading formats like book, large print, audiobook, or playaway (you can choose more than one).

Next comes the fun part... you will click through a series of buttons that let us know what you like and don't like in all kinds of genres, both fiction and non-fiction. We've also provided boxes for you to give us even more specific preferences.

Our friendly and knowledgeable librarians will choose a selection of titles based on your preferences. They will be checked out to your account for three weeks. Once you've filled out the form, you will receive an email confirming that we received your preferences, and another when your Fox Picks are ready.

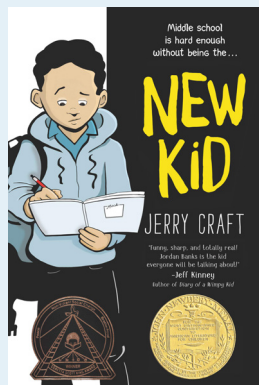
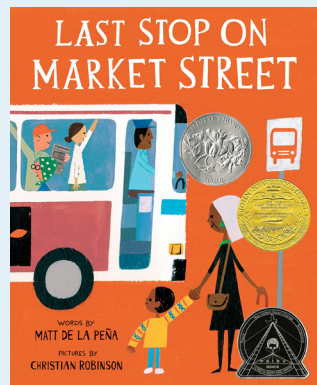
STORYWALK® IN WAHOO WOODS
