





8 LIBRARY HACKS FOR SAVVY CARD USERS

- 1. When it comes to new books or DVDs, there are "Prize Picks" and "New Releases." Prize Picks are new releases that are kept out of the hold system so that we can get them into the hands of more patrons. They can be checked out for seven days with no renewals. The hack comes in when you're at the library in front of the shelves. If you see a title you want on the Prize Picks shelf, take a quick look for the same title in New Releases. If it is there, check out the new release version. Then you've got a chance to renew it if you don't finish it in one week.
- 2. Make sure you suspend your holds before you go on vacation if you're going to be gone for more than five days. You wouldn't want that title you've been waiting on to come in and then go out while you're away. You can do this at www.frvpld.info, My Accounts tab.
- 3. Use Novelist (found on www.frvpld.info, Research tab) to find the perfect reading recommendations. Novelist has a great search function. You can enter random words like "small town winter new year's eve." Within each of the title descriptions that come up in your results, there is a link that says "Check the library catalog." This is directly connected to the FRVPLD catalog. If we do not have the book on our shelf, just place a hold.
- 4. Use the checkout history feature in My Accounts to keep track of materials you have checked out. It is an opt-in feature. It will start keeping your history when you first turn it on.
- 5. To maximize your check out minimums, make sure everyone in your family has a library card. Each cardholder gets five downloads a month from Hoopla, five songs a week from Freegal, five video game check outs at a time, etc.
- 6. Did you get a new phone or tablet? Make a one-on-one appointment with our digital services staff if you need help getting it set up. One of the most frequent requests is for help syncing email on a smart phone.
- 7. If you are a student (or the parent of one!) you can get your essays or papers reviewed using the Brainfuse HelpNow resource. Simply upload your document, and one of their writing experts will analyze it and provide helpful comments. You can find this at www.frvpld.info, in the Research tab.
- 8. FRVPLD offers three resources for downloading ebooks and audiobooks: Overdrive/Libby, Axis360, and Hoopla. If a title you are looking for is not available in one, check out the others.



Be sure to look for the FRVPLD "Living Window" on Friday, Nov. 30 from 6 to 8 p.m. We will help bring the holidays to life at our inaugural window at 104 North River Street in East Dundee. We've got a very special display in the works, including a tree that could only be constructed by librarians!




