FRVPLD WAIVES GOODBYE TO LATE FINES

Starting on January 1, patrons of the Fox River Valley Public Library district will no longer be charged fines for materials that are returned late. In addition, existing overdue fines will be waived from all patron accounts.

8 Most Important Things to Know

- 1. No overdue fines does not mean "no responsibility." There will still be due dates. We will still send reminders, and auto-renewals will continue as they do now.
- 2. At 14 days after the due date, materials not returned or renewed are marked as long overdue. Until those materials are returned, that person will be unable to check out anything else. At 45 days, items will be marked as lost and the patron's account will be billed for replacement.
- 3. Due to the higher cost of replacement, some items in our collection will continue to accrue fines: hotspots, laptops, and kits such as American Girl Dolls, Early Learning, and STEAM kits.
- 4. It is a common misconception that we rely on fines for our funding. Overdue fines represent a tiny fraction of our annual budget it's actually less than 1% (.55%) of our revenue.
- 5. Of the 10,321 patrons who have overdue fines on their accounts, 3,633 of those are blocked from checking out materials because they owe more than \$10. Of those blocked, 940 are patrons under 18 years of age (the youngest turned 1 last month). We look forward to welcoming them ALL back to the library.
- 6. Results of a survey of the public in June showed that 78% of FRVPLD patrons were in favor of eliminating late fines.
- 7. The fine free policy is a national trend among libraries. The new policy results in large amounts of missing items returned to the library's collection along with the patrons who returned them. The Chicago Public Library is the largest metropolitan area to go fine-free, and they've seen a 248% increase in returned items since the announcement.
- 8. We will be purchasing additional copies of in-demand items to keep wait times low.

DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

IF I TOLD YOU THAT WE CIRCULATED 632,447 PHYSICAL AND DIGITAL ITEMS LAST YEAR, WOULD YOU BE ABLE TO TELL IF THAT WAS GOOD OR BAD?

It is usually this time of year that we take a look back at the numbers we generated over the last 12 months. Dollars, collections, people, programs, questions, downloads—it is a tangible way to see if we've grown and what trends are emerging.

The library has always been required to report financial and non-financial data to our Board of Trustees and public. For many years we created spreadsheets filled with columns and columns of numbers. They were informative, and we were fulfilling our duty to be transparent. But we also felt that transparency was not enough; reports need to be understandable. If the numbers weren't clearly telling our story, we couldn't use them to make savvy, insightful decisions and plans.

In 2014 we ditched the data tables and instead posted .pdf graphs. The graphs were an improvement because at least the user could discern some context, but still, they were certainly not a 21st century solution.

Last year, I attended the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) Annual Conference with the specific mission of finding a tool that would compile and present our data in a useful way for our board and public.

I went to a session about OpenGov, a citizen engagement suite of resources that provides a platform to share stories with data driven content, connect with the community on topics that matter most, and directly involve residents in decision making processes. We engaged with many of you using this tool for our recent Fine Free and Planning for the Future surveys. It was helpful to us in making the decision to begin waiving late fines, as announced on page one. In that survey, 78% of FRVPLD patrons were in favor of eliminating late fines.


I'm proud to report we are the first library in the nation to use OpenGov to tell our story to the library board and public. Since then, we introduced OpenGov to RAILS (Reaching Across Illinois Library System), who have partnered up to provide public libraries special discounted pricing to members. We were honored to present this information to many Illinois libraries at the Illinois Library Association Conference this fall.

So instead of an annual report, I am going to direct you to our transparency dashboard which can be found on our website at www.frvpld.info. With the click of a mouse, you can drill down from an annual total to each check written by the library. This allows us to tell our story every day of the year.




P.S. By the way, we DID circulate 632,447 physical and digital items in FY18/19. And it is good...it is a 19% increase from last year!





To accommodate an increase in requests for notary service for our community, we have sent more staff members to notary training and are in the process of receiving their official commissions.

Soon, notary services will be available at both the Dundee Library and the Randall Oaks Library, including evening and weekend hours. Currently, notary hours are Monday through Thursday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Friday from 9 a.m. to noon. Extended service is expected to be available in mid-January.

Since every notary need is unique, we highly recommend calling the library before you come over to make sure you have all the necessary information and documentation.

Some other helpful tips:

- Bring a photo ID with your signature.
- Do not sign the document(s) prior to arriving.
- If your document requires witnesses we recommend you bring your own.
- Witnesses should not be related or have an interest in the document.
